## **Taskforce Expectations & Concerns**

### **Expectations**

- Build on JIMH work
- Leverage diverse opinions
- Comprehensive plan development
- Use of data for informed decisionmaking
- Significant involvement from people with lived experience
- Supportive facilitation by RDA
- Level-setting
- Real, impactful system-wide continuum of care

### **Shared Concerns**

- How will CFJL build on JIMH?
- Potential for duplication of efforts
- Taskforce makeup:
  - Absence of Superior court & Police department representation
  - Level of representation of community members & those with lived experience
- Diverse perspectives may challenge consensus
- Need for racial equity lens

### **EXPAND & INTERCONNECT SERVICES**

- Treatment centers
- Interagency collaboration & Holistic interventions

### **REDUCE/ADDRESS BARRIERS TO SUCCESS**

Access to care regardless of eligibility

## OUTREACH/LAW ENFORCEMENT INTERACTIONS

- More social workers for mental health calls/co-responders
- Police more responsive to community needs

### **PREVENTION**

• Prioritize treatment outside of jail

### **EQUITY FRAMEWORKS**

- Racial equity lens across all programs
- Trauma-informed
- Svcs responsive to persistent MH needs

### **CLARITY OF MISSION**

- Collective vision
- County as champion of Care First model

### **SUSTAINABILITY OF MODEL**

- Accountability
- Simplification of systems

### **FUNDING/BUDGET**

Reflection of priorities (funding follows needs)

### Care First Jails Last (CFJL) Taskforce

Target Population: Adults & youth with mental illness, substance abuse, and co-occurring disorders

Justice-involved adults with behavioral health needs

Target Population: MediCal eligible individuals (focus on pre-release and reentry)

California
Advancing and
Innovating MediCal (CalAIM)

Target Population: Justice-involved adults in Alameda County

Reimagine Adult Justice (RAJ)

Justice-involved adults eligible for Medi-Cal MediCal eligible, justice-involved adults with behavioral health needs

## **Facilitation Strategy**

- Taskforce process that is active, inclusive, and member-driven
- Leverage and build on existing work (other initiatives)
- Phased approach to subcommittee work



## **Phase Objectives**

- Phase 1: Shared understanding of CFJL model and SIM framework to promote inclusive participation
- Phase 2: System design based on robust intercepts
- Phase 3: Actionable plans and implementation timeline



## **Subcommittee Structure**

### Initial:

- Data
- Education
- Finance

(Now - Sept '22)

### Content:

SIM-based planning (one for each intercept)

(Phase 2 - Sept '22-March '23)

### Deliverables:

- Agency focused plans creation
- County-wide roadmap

(Phase 3 - March '23 - April '24)



# Proposed Initial Subcommittees

### Data

- Identify the data required to understand population needs and impact measurement
- Coordinate across subcommittees to create unified data requests/reporting

### **Finance**

- Examine budgets and funding mechanisms for existing models Develop budget for CFJL model implementation

### Education

- Continue to identify information needs of Task Force members Advise on outside sources for potential programs and models
